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Polydactyly

Extra Toes

When born, a person with Polydactyly can have extra toes. They can be either just tissue, or with a full bone structure.



Appendages

The appendages are your fingers or toes. There are people with extra ones, and this condition is called Polydactyly.



Surgery

Sometimes, the extra appendages may need surgery to be removed. This is usually done under general anaesthetic.



Genetic Disorder

Polydactyly is a genetic disorder that can be passed down through generations of family.



Birth Condition

Polydactyly is a birth condition only. It cannot be caught, or passed on once you are born.

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
