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Kidneys

Shaped like a bean, your kidneys (there are two) process your blood to remove toxins and forgegn bodies from it. They create urine, which is stored in the bladder.



Bladder

The bladder is a small sac that stores the urine processed by the kidneys until you are required to excrete them.



Adrenal Gland

The adrenal glands are both above each kidney, and they produce hormones that control your metabolism, immune system and give a response to stress.



Urethra

The small pipe that runs from the bladder to each of the reproductive organs in a human's body, the urethra enables the passage of urine through.



Urea

Formed from the breakdown of proteins in the liver, urea is excreted alongside the urine, and it's what gives the urine it's smell.



Digestive System

Your digestive system is linked to the urinary system, as the latter is what happens to the foods you've eaten after it's been digested.



Urinary System

The urinary system is a series of organs that work on removing the waste products from your body.



Excretory System

Another term for the urinary system, but which includes the feces you get rid of as well, after you've eaten and digested food.



Anus

The anus is strictly part of the digestive system, however, it plays a role in excreting waste product from your body after digestion.



Rectum

The rectum, while part of the digestive system, is a holding place for waste materials of the food you eat before excretion by the anus.
