Ribcage

There are 24 ribs that connect at the back and front of your body that are collectively called the ribcage.



False Ribs

There are several ribs that don't connect to the sternum (breast bone), and these are called false ribs.



Breast Bone

The breast bone is situated in the middle at the front of the ribcage, and helps connect most of the ribs to it to help protect the organs inside.



Sternum

The sternum is also called the breast bone, and protects the organs within the ribcage. In CPR, if this doesn't break, you're not doing it right.



Thoracic Vertebrae

In the middle section of the spine, is the thoracic vertebrae. They connect the ribs at the back of your body.



Spine

Your spine, while protecting the spinal cord within, also helps protect the organs inside the ribcage, by connecting 12 ribs to it at the back.
